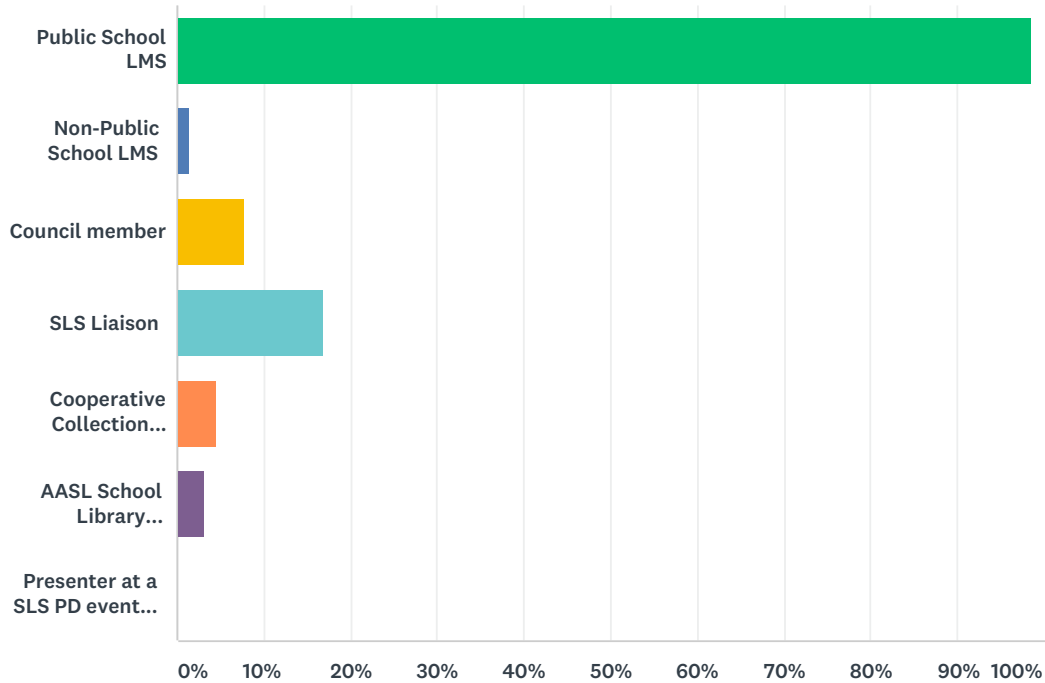

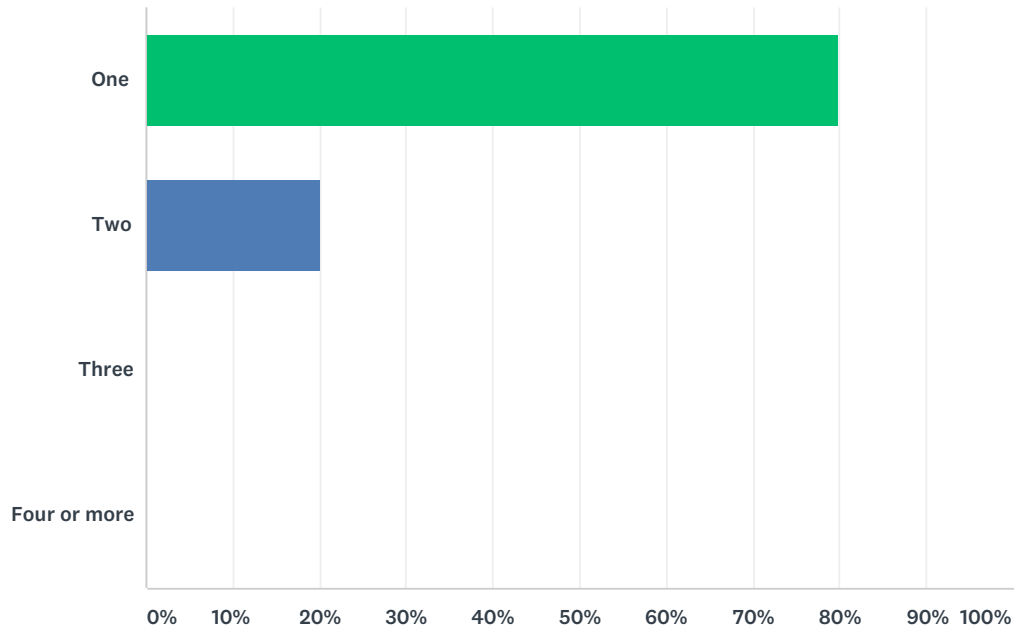

Q2 How many different buildings do you currently work in?

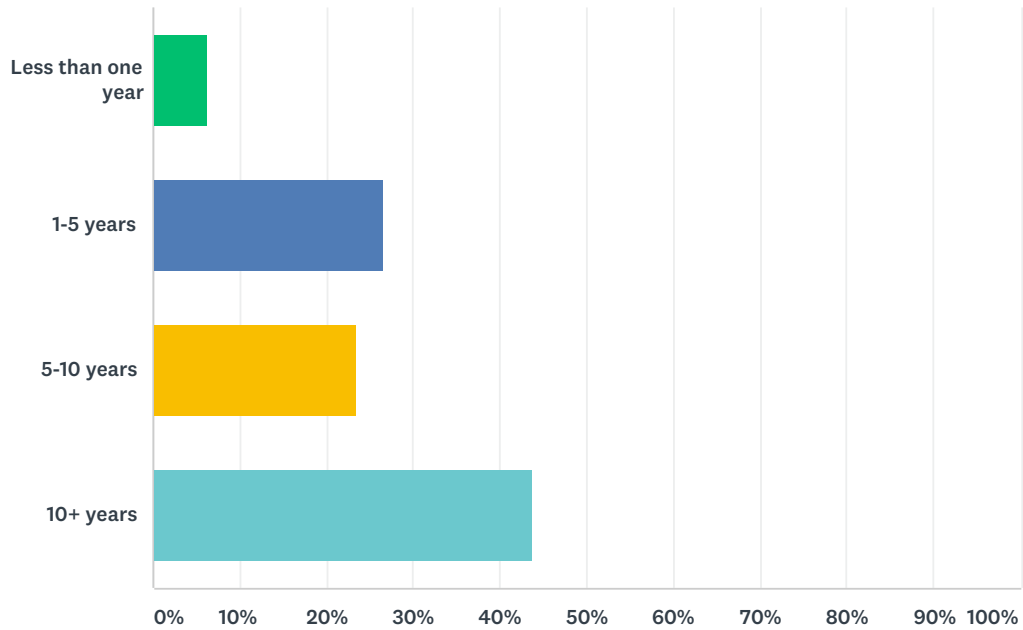

Q3 How long have you been working in your current building(s)?

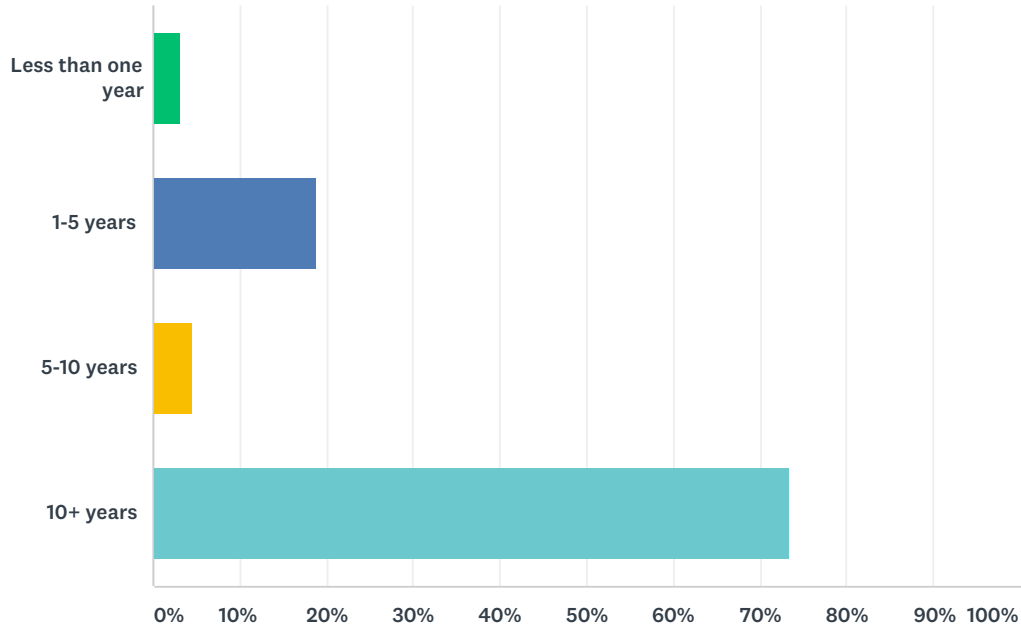

Q4 How long have you worked in your current district?

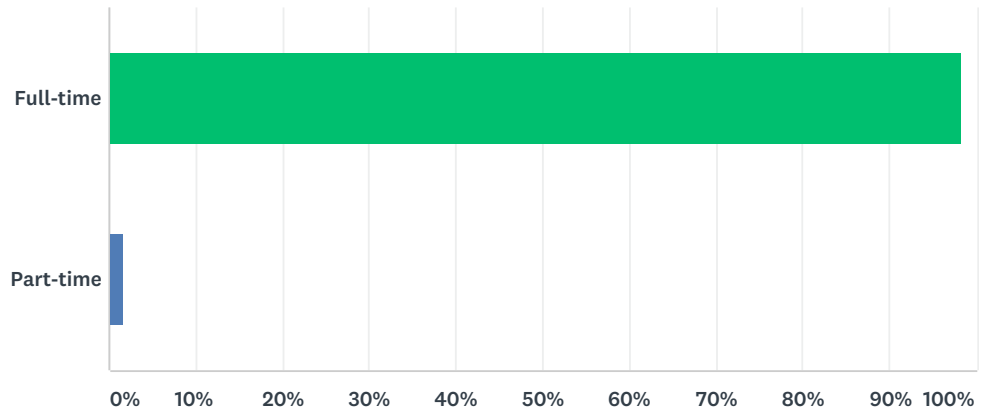

Q5 Are you working in a full-time or part-time position?

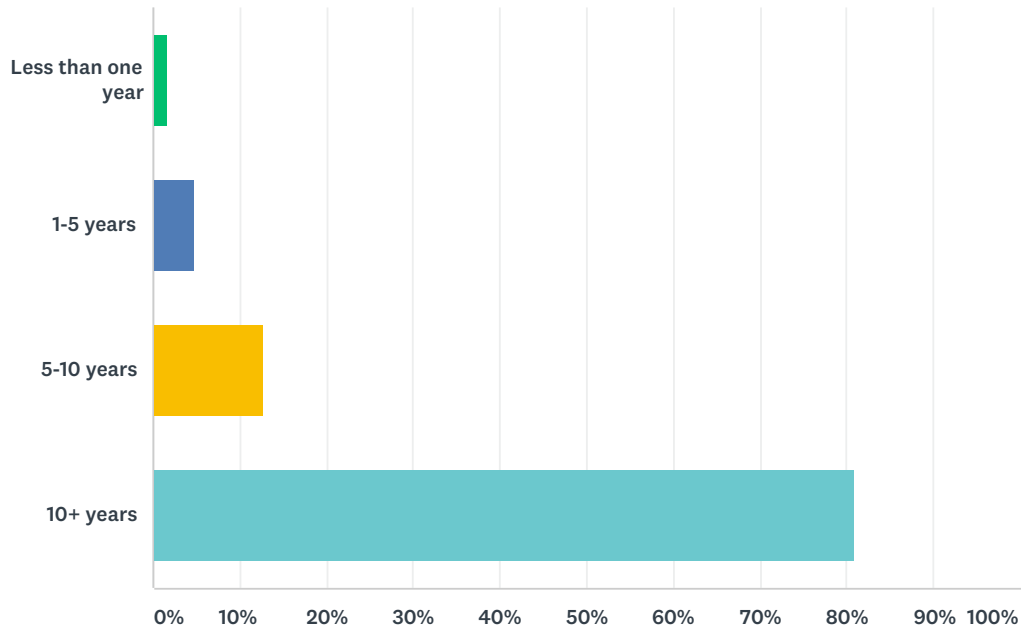

Q6 How long have you worked as an SLMS?

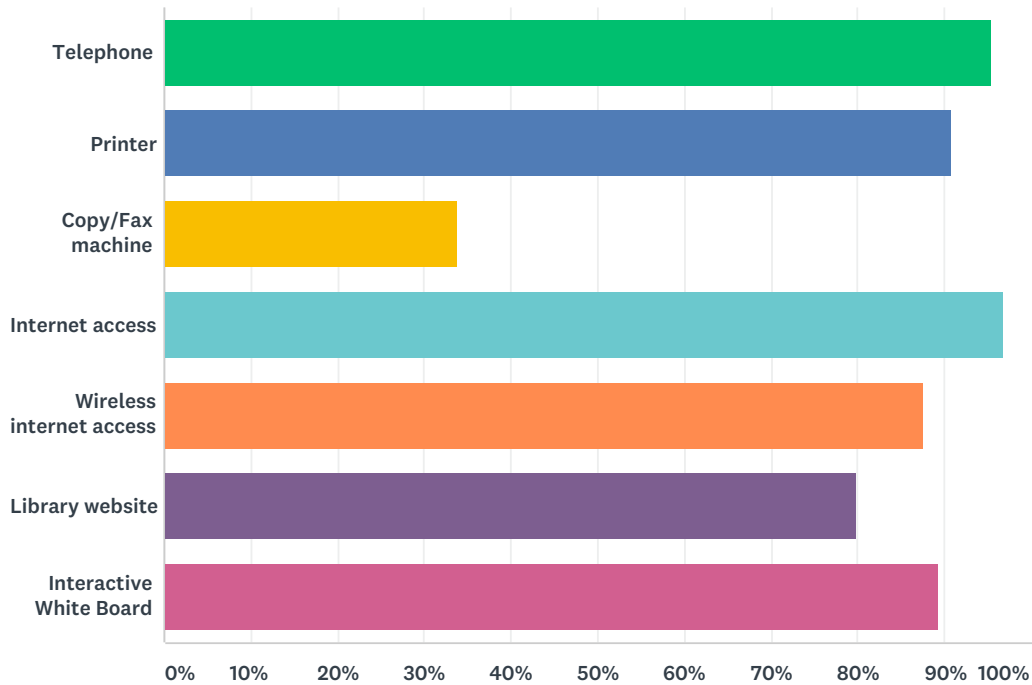

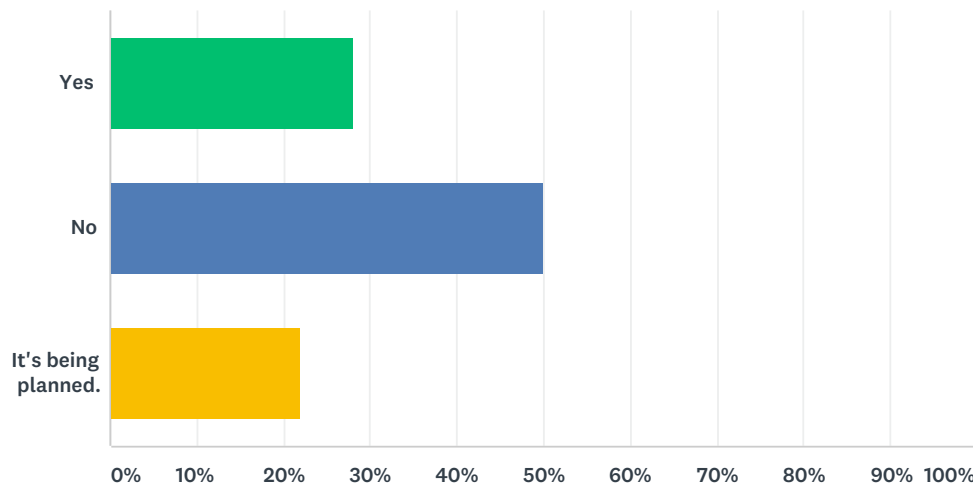

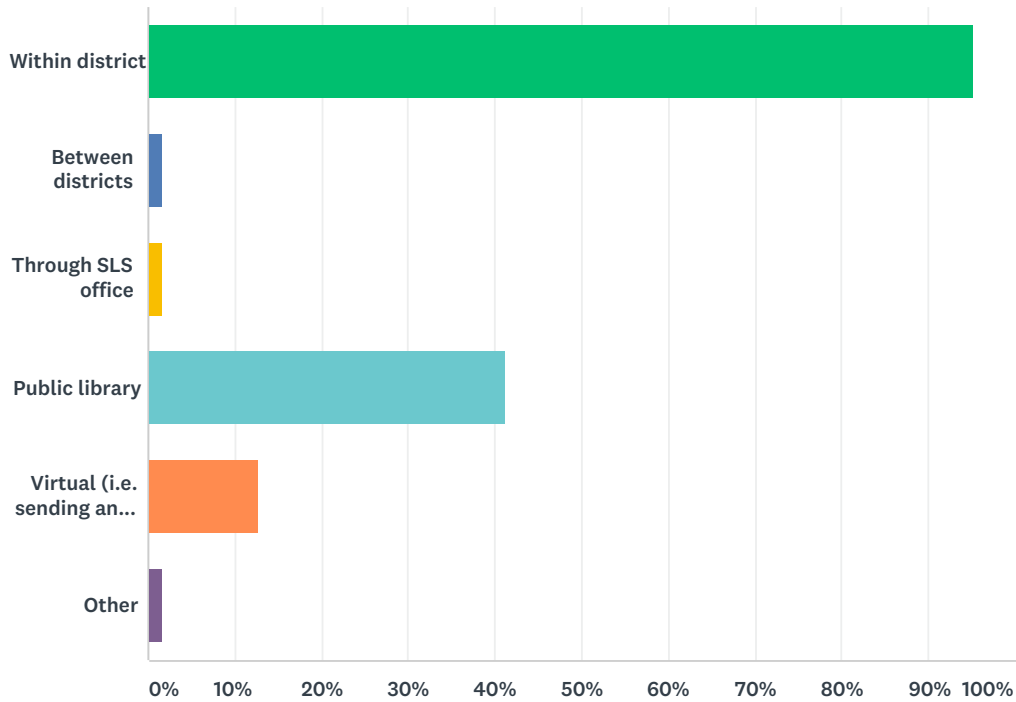

Q13 Please check all that apply. What form of interlibrary loan have you used?

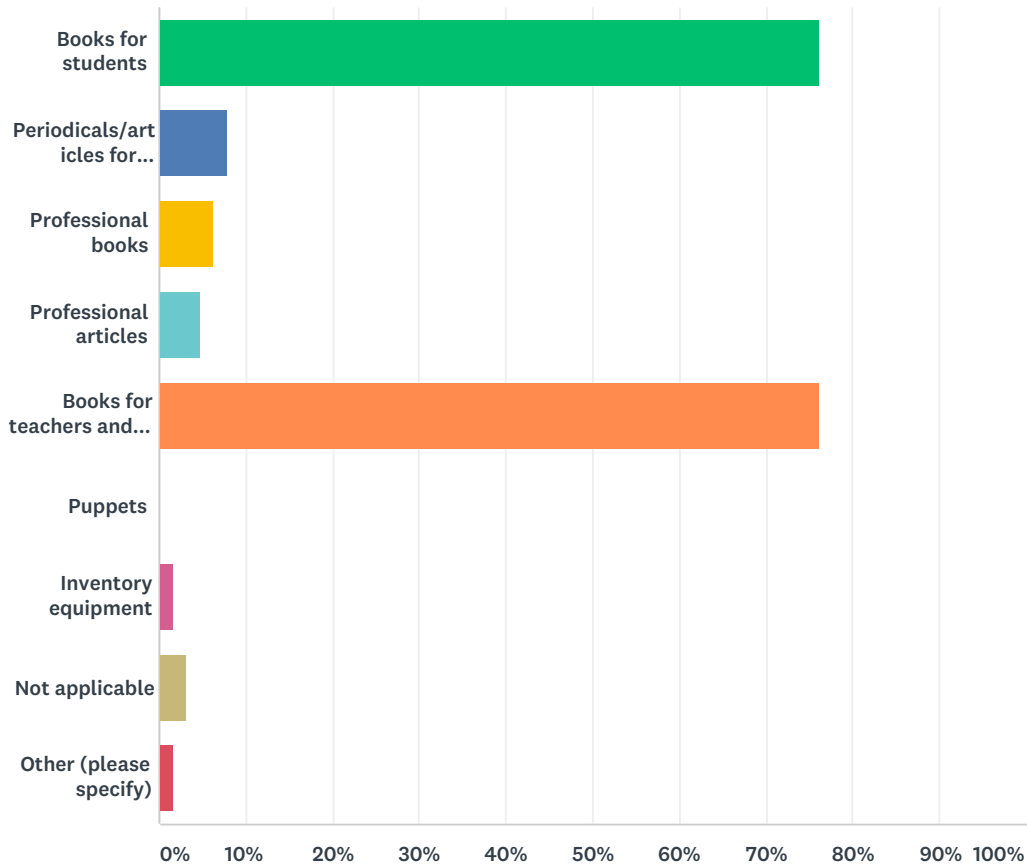

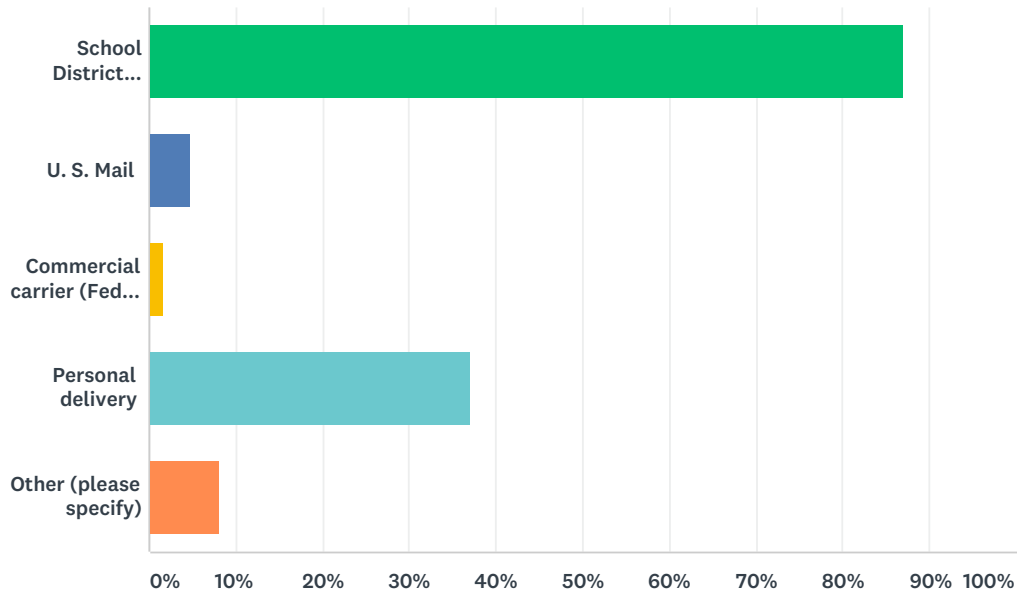

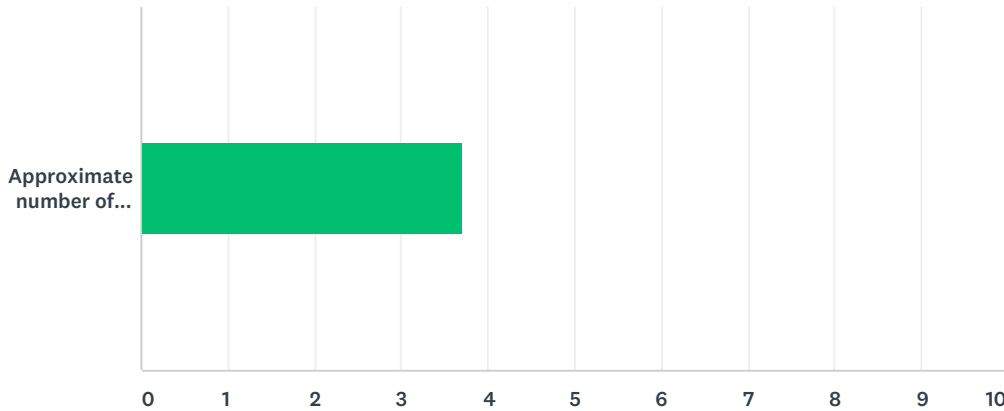

Q17 How much has ILL helped improve your ability to provide resources?

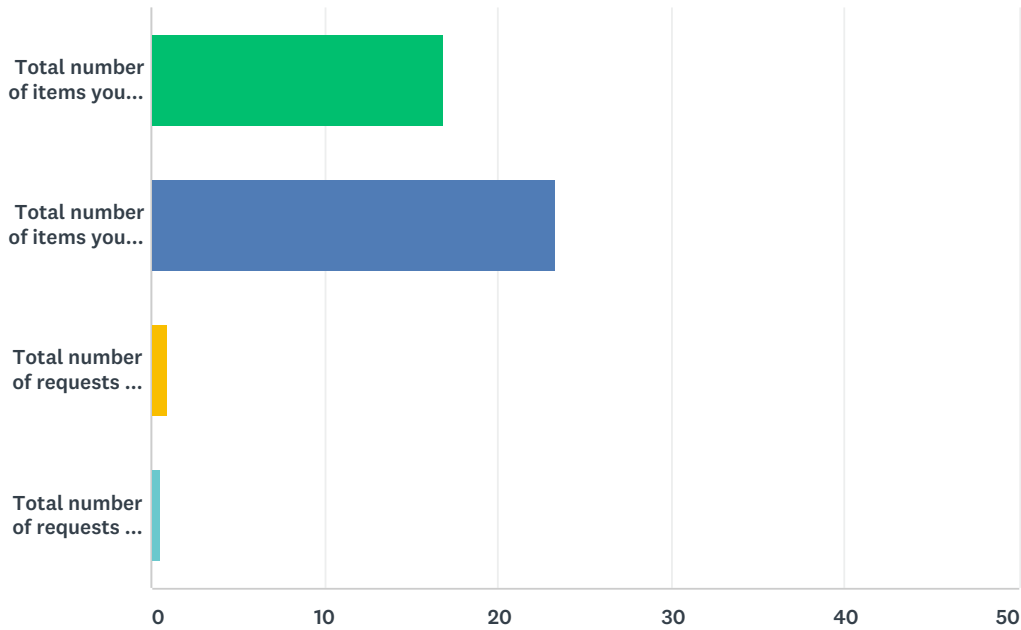

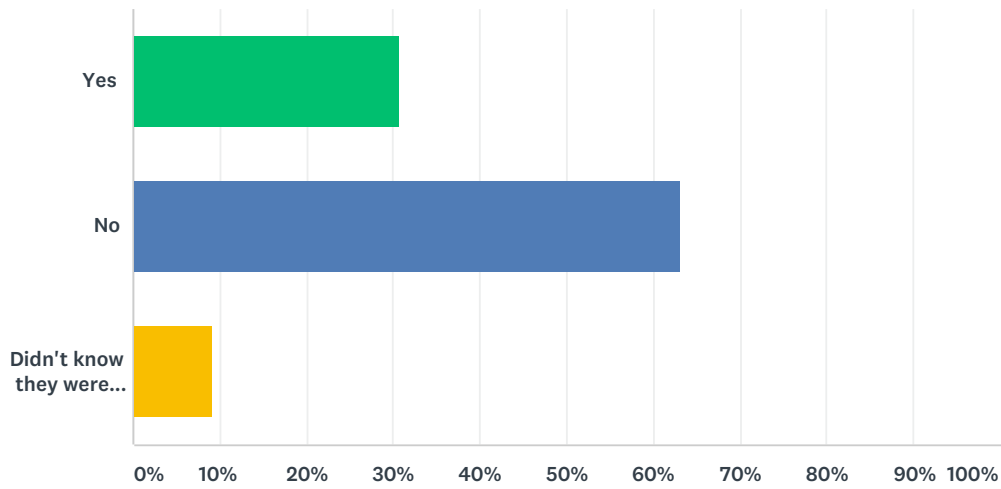

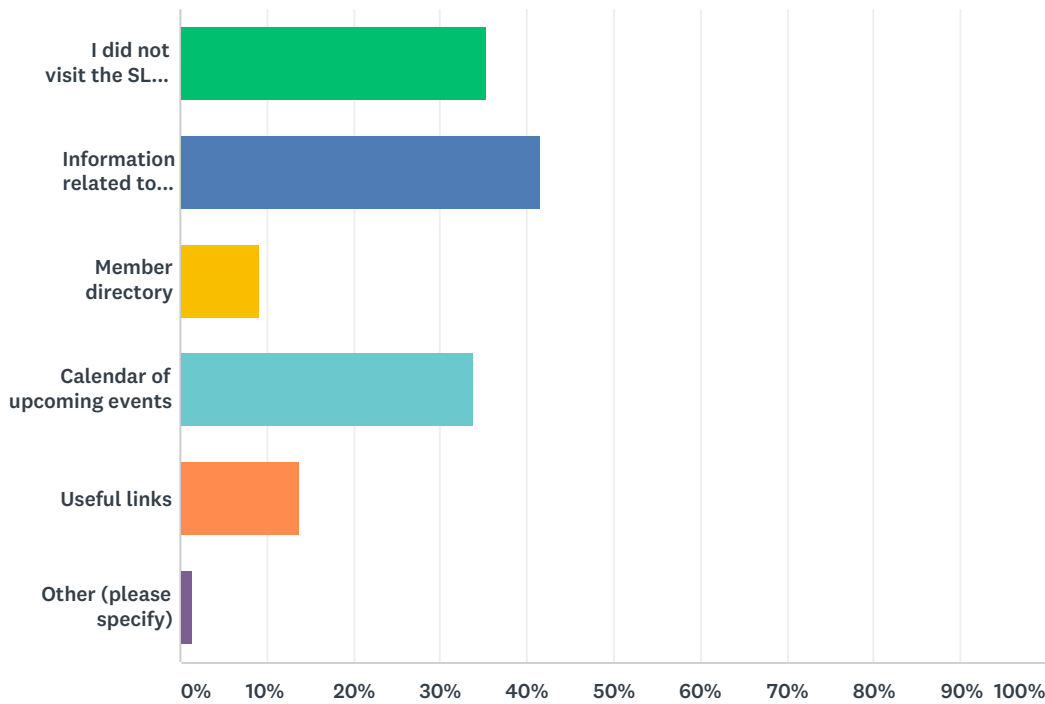
