Part-time Programs

1. If we cancel a course, all your fees are totally refunded.
2. If you cannot attend a class that has been rescheduled to a time or place other than advertised, you are entitled to a full refund.
3. If you withdraw from a class before the first scheduled class meeting, a full tuition refund, less a withdrawal fee of \$25, will be made after the withdrawal* is requested in writing.
4. If you withdraw after the first scheduled class meeting but before the second class meeting, one-half of the tuition, less a withdrawal fee

of \$25, will be refunded after withdrawal* is requested in writing.

NOTE: No refunds for any dance or fitness class after the first class begins.

5. All extra costs, such as books or equipment that were not included in tuition price, are not subject to refund.

6. We are unable to provide refunds for requests received after the second scheduled class meeting.
